Spring has sprung which means it's time to get your lawn in pristine condition. For some, this means watering your lawn with an irrigation system. Before turning on your sprinkler, make sure it has been properly tested to avoid backflow. Backflow happens when a customer's water flows from their house to the public water supply instead of the other way around.

Indiana Department of Environmental Management (IDEM) requires all irrigation systems have properly working backflow prevention devices installed. Backflow prevention devices must be tested by state-certified testers every year.

Citizens recently partnered with ArchonSafe, a leading technology based backflow management firm, to further enhance efforts to protect the public drinking water supply from backflow contamination. Coal Car Makes Final Delivery to Perry K Steam Plant

The last trainload of coal was delivered to Citizens' Perry K Steam Plant on Monday, March 11. Perry K, located downtown across from Lucas Oil Stadium, has been burning coal for 121 years but will now burn only natural gas. Burning natural gas is more cost effective, cleaner and safer.

Three of the plant's coal boilers have already been converted to natural gas. The final boiler will be converted by June. Once the conversion process is complete, Citizens will clean the plant's ash silos, its exterior walls, and paint the stacks. Several companies have already expressed interest in purchasing the locomotive and rail cars used to transport the coal.

Perry K produces steam for many large buildings, hospitals and industries in downtown Indianapolis. The steam is distributed to Citizens' customers through its district steam system, which is the second largest system in the U.S. $% \left({{{\rm{U}}_{\rm{S}}}} \right)$
