



## Easement Checklist for Developers Prior to Submission Citizens

This is a guide for developers when submitting easement documents for water and sanitary main extensions to the REACH team and what is typically required with each document.

Required documents for ALL easements:

1. CAD file,
2. Deed,
3. Easement legal language,
  - a. All exhibits outlined in easement document.
4. Recorded Plat.
  - a. If easement language refers to a recorded plat or is within a platted area.

Requirements for each document:

1. CAD file
  - a. File must be AutoCAD 2016 or earlier,
  - b. File must be in State Plane East coordinates,
  - c. File must only be the outline of the easement boundary. Nothing else will be accepted within the file.
2. Deed
  - a. Document must be recorded,
  - b. Document must have the parcel number<sup>1</sup>,
  - c. Document must have the correct parcel owner when compared to the parcel owner in the appropriate county's GIS system.
3. Easement legal language
  - a. Document must be on the correct territory (Indianapolis vs Westfield), utility (water vs sanitary) and type (temporary vs non-exclusive) template,
  - b. Document must contain the correct cross-reference number(s) from the deed and recorded plat (if referenced),
  - c. Document must contain the correct parcel number from the county GIS,
  - d. Document must contain the correct grantor that is the *exact*<sup>2</sup> same as the grantor on the deed,
  - e. Document must be filled out with all necessary grantor information (date, grantor signature, name, title, and company),
  - f. Document must be notarized,
  - g. Document must contain all exhibits as outlined in the document,
    - i. If an exhibit has multiple pages, all sheets must be labeled with exhibit name and include page numbers (i.e. Exhibit A; 1 of 2, Exhibit A; 2 of 2).
  - h. Document must only contain 8.5"x11" sheets.
4. Recorded Plat
  - a. Document must be recorded.

<sup>1</sup> Does not necessarily have to match parcel number on GIS.

<sup>2</sup> The grantor must be exactly the same. This includes any punctuation, words, letters, etc. i.e., a comma or a "the" must be included.
