Clean Air Act Requirements for RICE Engines



In recent years, the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) has increased it regulation of toxic air emissions that come from internal combustion engines. The National Emission Standards for Hazardous Air Pollutants (NESHAP) for Reciprocating Internal Combustion Engines (RICE) now regulates all sizes of stationary combustion engines. That includes all emergency backup power at major and area sources of hazardous air pollutants (HAP).

Since 2004, EPA has regulated engines greater than 500 horsepower (HP) at major HAP sources. Since 2008, EPA has also regulated new engines located at major and area HAP sources. Now, however, EPA regulates <u>all</u> compression ignition (diesel) and spark ignition (natural gas, gasoline, propane, etc.) engines at major and area HAP sources. This includes non-emergency engines greater than 500 HP.

The most recent update to the regulation means new and existing compression ignition engines not previously covered by the EPA regulation, must demonstrate compliance by May 3, 2013 and spark ignition engines must demonstrate compliance by October 19, 2013.

Depending upon the size, type, and date of manufacture, an engine will need to undertake compliance activities containing specific emission requirements. Some of those requirements could include tracking fuel usage, maintenance activities, and hours of operation. Additionally, emissions testing and air pollution control may be needed.

Chiller Boiler Plant at Eskenazi Health

Two 3,000 ton chillers at the plant became operational in early June and are now available to provide cooling to Eskenazi Hospital, as well as to the remainder of Citizens' district cooling system. This brings the total capacity of cooling system system to over 60,000 tons.


Work on the three 27,000 pounds per hour natural gasfired boilers is progressing as well. The boilers will be test fired during the last two weeks of July.
